A milestone is reached !

This issue of the North East Rowing News happens to be the 50th Issue, and with it, a new look which I hope meets with your approval. It was in fact in February 1973 that Chris Kenyon, now our ARA Divisional Representative, took the idea of a regional newsheet a step further, with the publication of the very first North East Rowing News. The early issues were all typed onto stencils and then produced on a gestetner duplicating machine. (Incidentally, that duplicating machine is still in my attic, and as it is somewhat redundant these days, is available free of charge to anyone who wants it, along with paper, inks and stencils).

The very first edition met with great approval, and twenty years later, I know that it is still eagerly read. Times change, of course, and the NERN is now produced on an 80386 computer using Wordperfect software, and Timeworks Desktop Publishing (from this issue), and printed on a laser printer, and still typed in it's entirety by yours truly - hence the occasional spelling mistake -although these are somewhat reduced by the use of the computer based spellchecker.

Chris Kenyon actually produced the first 19 issues, and after a short break, it was I who picked up the job, and in the absence of volunteers, have continued it ever since, and have produced the last 31 issues.

Of course, the NERN could not be produced without the help of the contributors, and the advertisers. Over the years the NERN has been supported by many companies with whom we have regular business, and a special mention has to be made of Erik Whiteley (and formerly Clive Hole) of Browns Boathouse, who have been most welcome supporters for a long time. Of our other supporters, the newest is JACKMATE TROPHIES. Jack Hesketh has continued his support for another year, but he advises he is still waiting for his first order from the region. Please remember without the support of people like Jack, the NERN would not be around - might I suggest that Regatta Secretaries ask for a quote for this season's trophies - it could well be to your advantage. Jack is also a supplier of blazer badges, woven badges and ties.

Hopefully the next NERN will be published in March, so let's have your reports by return of post...

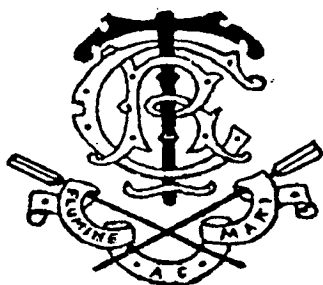

TYNEMOUTH ROWING CLUBS 125TH

Tynemouth Rowing Club held a memorable 125th Anniversary Dinner at the Watch House of the Tynemouth Volunteer Life Brigade. The Life Brigade



was formed in 1864, and the Rowing Club three years later, with many of the founding members of the TVLB also being founders of the Rowing Club. In unique surroundings, the Club welcomed Neil Thomas, President of the Amateur Rowing Association,

the Reverend John Lund of Durham ARC, and T.I. Wagstaff of Tyne Rowing Club as the speakers. A most enjoyable evening was had by all, with the proceedings going on until 2 a.m. Neil Thomas presented the Club with a certificate to mark the special occasion, and the Club President, John Tait presented an engraved tankard in return.

CAMBOIS ARC

After many months of doubt as to the future of Cambois Rowing Club following their disastrous fire, work is now well underway on a new building to house the Club. The new building is constructed of brick and protected steel cladding, and is large enough to house 15 eights. The new building is costing £42,000, and the cost is being met by the Club, assisted with grants from the Sports Council and Wansbeck District Council. Although the initial construction time was given as 16 weeks, work has proceeded erratically, but the steel framework of the building is finished, along with the base wall. Completion is now expected in February 1993.

Cambois have managed to keep some crews rowing by keeping their small fleet of boats in a barn at a nearby farm, and transporting them to the river for outings. The Northern Rowing Council has also loaned them three sculling boats and oars.

RUTHERFORD HEAD RACE

It never ceases to amaze me how many crews enter Head Races without knowing what they are really about. For those who were competing, I can tell you that the occasionally impatient Starter on the day was none other than Yours Truly, but it has to be said that when crews, or their coxes (and presumably their coaches too) do not make it clear to competitors how a Head Race is operated, then it is no wonder that chaos sometimes reigns. There were three crews who approached the start and when their number was called just prior to the word "Go!", they actually stopped rowing and drifted up to the timing line. There were another two crews who wouldn't move up to the start when told. There were eight or nine crews who started out of order. There were three crews whose race numbers were missing or obscured. And one crew (Senior Open) started to remove their outer garments when told to start! In order that crews will have a better understanding of what Head racing is about, and in the hope that this issue will be produced in time for the Durham and Tyne Head Races, here are the few important things you need to know:

- ☞ You should boat in plenty of time to reach the marshalling area.
- ☞ You should look (or ask for) the race number of the crews beside you and get yourself into place.
- ☞ You should remove your outer garments when told to do so.
- ☞ You should make sure your race number is clearly visible (If the timekeepers can't see it, they can't time you).
- ☞ As you approach the start line, the Starter will say "Crew XX, Go!". It is a running start.
- ☞ You must give way, and not impede, passing crews.

If you follow these simple rules, you will be better prepared for your race, you will not test the patience of the officials, and you will be sure your time will be accurately recorded.

A special note of the catering arrangements at the Rutherford Head (and I presume the same at the Tyne Head in March); the standard of the food was much, much better. A superb selection was available and this time at reasonable prices - Well done

Tyne Rowing Club ! This is what competitors and spectators enjoy.

One unfortunate lady competitor became quite ill during the race, but medical assistance was quickly at hand in the form of a doctor, and an ambulance was called for without delay.

Not too many of the new Hatchet Blades were in evidence, but Queen Elizabeth High School had a quad full !

EQUIPMENT FOR HIRE

As usual there is a selection of regatta equipment for hire for the 1993 season. A P.A. system, 2-way radios, and loudhailers. Regrettably the hire charges have increased this year, but only marginally. This is due to the hefty repair costs due to damaged equipment last year. Two radios were dropped (Repair bill £120), and a loudhailer. Also, it is planned to purchase some new loudhailers before the regatta season starts.

STOCKTON REGATTA

Stockton Regatta has not been held for a year or two now due to construction work taking place at the regatta site. There are major developments taking place at Teeside, and the Club will benefit due to the construction of a barrage across the river which will give a "Permanent High Tide". Although it would be possible to hold a regatta in 1994, the organisers have decided to wait until 1995 when the completion of the barrage will allow the event to become non-tidal. This will also make for much better water conditions, as the "wind against tide" phenomenon will no longer create rather boisterous conditions.

JAMES RENFORTH

The last two issues of the North East Rowing News have covered the times of James Renforth, one of Tyneside's most famous oarsmen. The magnificent statue of Renforth, which used to be sited in Whickham Churchyard has been beautifully restored and moved to it's new location outside the Shipley Art Gallery in Gateshead. The statue was unveiled at a sadly un-publicised ceremony in October, but is well worth a visit by anyone interested in the history of our sport and it's people.

TYNEMOUTH REGATTA 1994

A possible new venue is being considered by the organisers of Tynemouth Regatta at a new site, based at the Tyne Police Marine Headquarters recently constructed on one of the finest rowing-stretches of the river. The Police have expressed an interest in assisting this event, but if it comes off, you'd better check your vehicle is legal, and your

trailer is safely loaded !

The first moves to allow Tynemouth access to better water conditions is underway at the Royal Quays development at North Shields. Discussions are well underway for the first stage of the project, which is to provide landing facilities to the marina, and also to the river.

George Parsonage of Clydesdale and his rowing partner Kenny Munro visited the Veteran Championships in Cologne last year. As ever, George the comedian was fooling around in the supermarket near to the course with a comb on his upper lip, marching the goosestep imitating you-know-who. His latest escapade was in April 1992, when as part of a five-man team, he trekked 276 miles in 20 days in bitterly cold temperatures to reach the North Pole, without the aid of teams of dogs, snowmobiles or air support. The press coverage was extremely interesting but I particularly liked Jock's answers to a reporter's questions (perhaps because of the toilet humour aspect - and I mean that literally!)

The junior oarsmen of the Club were delighted to be able to look up to oarspersons of such standing, and believe me, looking up are the operative words when you are standing next to Terry.

After a lengthy Saturday morning outing with one crew, the Club lunched at the Boathouse pub at Newburn, and a brief session followed. The Sunday morning was spent at Tynemouth, where Terry and Kim found out the true meaning of rough water ! Nevertheless, some useful advice was passed on to the Club members which is now being put into practice, and how pleasant it was to rub shoulders with International standard squad members who could take the time to help this small Club.

The Northern Rowing Council is pleased to announce the appointment of Gordon Beattie and Norman Howitt as co-ordinators for the Long Distance Sculling Head Series 1993. The pair will be guided on financial matters by the Treasurer of the NRC, Kevin Flannery. Recent concern was expressed at the loss of over £400 on the 1992 series, and it is felt that more attention needs to be paid to the financial aspect of the series. It was planned that the series would be breaking even in 1992, but this has not been achieved. Good news is that entries are significantly up on previous years.

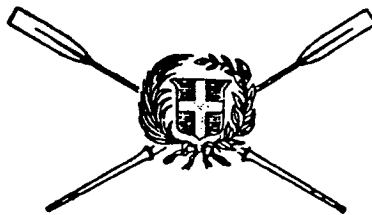

The club won a further 12 events at the regatta.



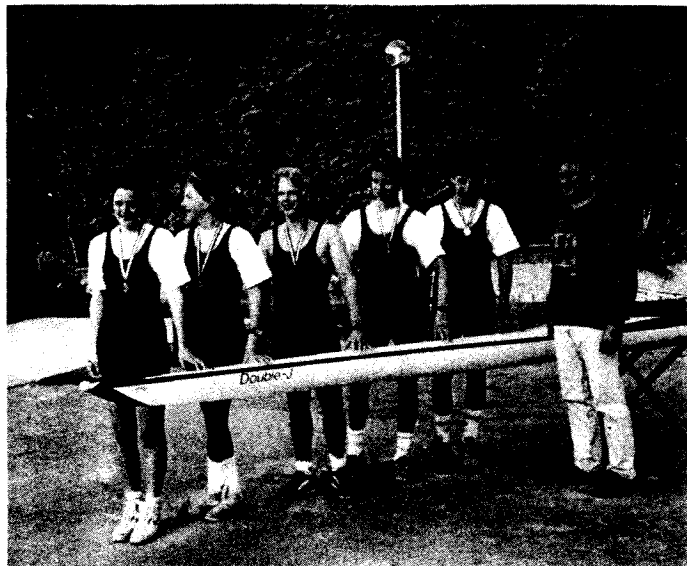
DARC ROWERS & TROPHIES AT DURHAM

SCHOOLS & NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

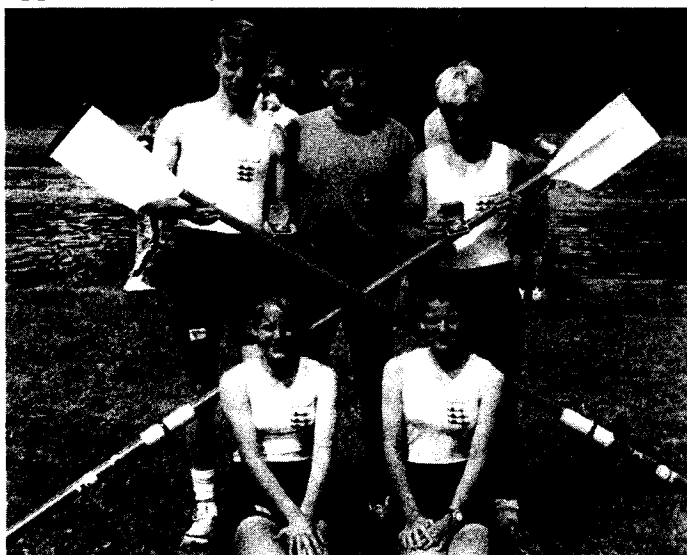

The total of wins at National Championships showed an improvement, all five of the above winning GOLD medals and other club members reaching the finals in J18 4+, WJ16 2x and J14 1x.



DURHAM'S NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

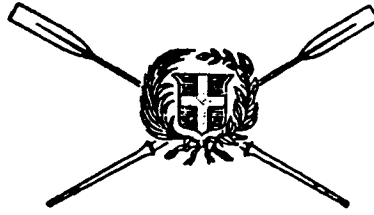

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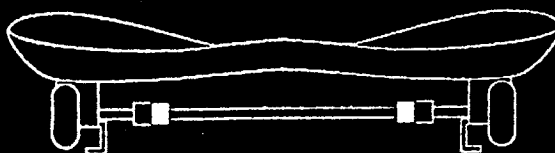
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
